UNITED STATES ATTORNEY INTERVENES AND SETTLES ACTION BROUGHT BY WHISTLEBLOWER REPRESENTED BY DIAMOND MCCARTHY, LLP

(July 26, 2012, New York, New York) Millions of dollars have been recovered for disadvantaged children. The Head Start Employees' Welfare Fund has agreed to pay \$4.8 million to the United States to settle claims that it diverted money that was to be used for children in the Head Start program by overbilling for insurance reimbursement for Head Start employees.

The settlement brings to a close a whistleblower action filed by Robert W. Sadowski and Raphael Katz of Diamond McCarthy LLP, under the federal False Claims Act. Sadowski and Katz brought the case on behalf of their client, a whistleblower, who alleged that the Fund was misusing federal money it received under a grant from the Head Start program, and that children in the Head Start program in New York City were being deprived of services they were supposed to receive.

The Head Start program is a national program that promotes school readiness by providing educational, health, nutritional, and social services to enrolled children and their families.

"This case shows that courageous whistleblowers can make a big difference in combating fraud and abuse involving taxpayer money. We are particularly pleased to have worked with the United States Attorney's office on a case where federal money was wrongfully diverted from a program aimed at helping disadvantaged children and their families," said Mr. Sadowski.
